Inhalation:

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

Suitable Extinguishing Media:

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Emergency procedures/Environmental precautions:

Personal precautions/Protective equipment/Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up:

Slippery when spilt. Avoid accidents, clean up immediately. Wear protective equipment to prevent skin and eye contact and breathing in dust. Work up wind or increase ventilation. Cover with damp absorbent (inert material, sand or soil). Sweep or vacuum up, but avoid generating dust. Collect and seal in properly labelled containers or drums for disposal. After cleaning, flush away any residual traces with water.
