## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

### Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures

**Personal precautions** Avoid contact with skin, eyes, and clothing. Avoid breathing dust / fume / gas / mist / vapours / spray. Ensure adequate ventilation. Evacuate personnel to safe areas. Do not touch or walk through spilled material. Wash thoroughly after handling. Use personal protective equipment as required.

**For emergency responders** Shut off ignition sources. Clear area of all unprotected personnel. Use personal protection recommended in Section 8.

### Environmental precautions

**Environmental precautions** Prevent further leakage or spillage if safe to do so. Keep out of drains, sewers, ditches and waterways. Refer to protective measures listed in Sections 7 and 8.

### Methods and material for containment and cleaning up

**Methods for containment** Stop leak if you can do it without risk. Do not touch or walk through spilled material. Remove ignition sources. Provide adequate ventilation. Dike far ahead of spill to collect runoff water. Absorb spill with inert material (e.g. dry sand or earth), then place in a chemical waste container.

**Methods for cleaning up** Dam up. Soak up with inert absorbent material. Vacuum or sweep material and place in a disposal container. Avoid generation of dust. Pick up and transfer to properly labelled containers. After cleaning, flush away traces with water.

## 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

### Precautions for safe handling

**Advice on safe handling** Avoid breathing dust or spray mist. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, and clothing. Use personal protection equipment. Keep away from open flames, hot surfaces and sources of ignition. Use according to package label instructions. Handle in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety practice.

**General hygiene considerations** Regular cleaning of equipment, work area and clothing is recommended. Wash hands and face before breaks and immediately after handling the product.
