### **Methods and material for containment and cleaning up**

**Methods for containment** Stop leak if you can do it without risk. Dike far ahead of spill to collect runoff water. Soak up condensate with inert absorbent material and collect in ventilated waste container for disposal.

**Methods for cleaning up** Slippery when wet. Dam up. Soak up with inert absorbent material. Vacuum or sweep material and place in a disposal container. Avoid generation of dust. Pick up and transfer to properly labelled containers.

## **7. HANDLING AND STORAGE**

### **Precautions for safe handling**

**Advice on safe handling** Avoid breathing dust or spray mist. Avoid contact with skin, eyes, and clothing. Use personal protection equipment. Use according to package label instructions. Handle in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety practice.
