**4. FIRST AID MEASURES**

**Description of first aid measures**

**General advice**

For advice, contact a Poisons Information Centre (e.g. phone Australia 13 11 26; New Zealand 0800 764 766) or a doctor. Show this safety data sheet to the doctor in attendance. Immediate medical attention is required.

**Inhalation**

Remove to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If breathing is irregular or stopped, administer artificial respiration. Get immediate medical advice/attention. Aspiration into lungs can produce severe lung damage. Delayed pulmonary edema may occur.

**Eye contact**

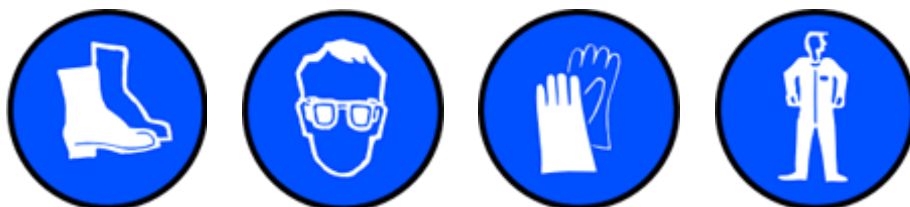
